At the Sept meeting If anyone would like to participate, the rules are simple.

- Three crayons will be selected at random.
- The objective is to use your colors and make something....
- It doesn't have to be a big or complicated item and could be made with any medium as long as you are the Maker.
- /We are a diverse and creative group.
- We will share at the November meeting.

# After the meeting we are going to weave a Tumbling Block Square.

It will be about the size of a chair cushion. The items to bring are:

- T pins
- Bias tape ½ yard of 3 contrasting colors. Or material that has been folded and has 2 crisp edges

# Tips, Techniques, Educational Soundbites:

If you've wanted to use hand-painted skeins of yarn for your warp *Handwoven* has quick directions to wind your warp in order to pool the colors. When winding a warp in the usual fashion the colors will mix and become mottled. To keep the colors pooled, the warp must make a circular path, beginning and ending at the same peg and the circular path must be a multiple of the skein length. See this link for directions:

# July Meeting Minutes, July 16, 2022

Attendance: 10. The meeting was opened at 10:00 with introductions and sharing favorite memorable picnics.

The minutes of the May meeting were approved with the correction that the card blanks, to create the cards like Sharon demonstrated, are available from Karen D. not Sharon S. Motion to approve by Val L., seconded by Ann K. It was also noted that the 3 motions presented at the May meeting, budget approval, presentation policy, establishment of a scholarship, which did not have a sitting quorum were passed through email participation in the days following the meeting. Notice of that fact had previously been emailed to all guild members.

The Treasurer, Ann K., reported the current balance of \$5815.12, with an expense of \$73.70 to Karen D. for the card blanks, and additions of \$300 for dues and \$5 for web ad.

The next meeting will be in Bayfield. The program is to be announced later as the planned program had to be cancelled due to the presenters illness.

There was a discussion about the November 19 & 20th workshop. Melodie will give a presentation to all the members during out business meeting and the workshop will continue after the meeting closes. It was announced that the participants' charge for the workshop is \$50 and the supply fee is \$20. There was more discussion on housing for Melodie, and how we will reimburse her since she is not charging the normal workshop fee. No final decision was made. There are looms available from Karen D. for participants that do not have a portable loom. A question that needs to be cleared with Melodie is if the workshop can be "audited" by a member who does not want to do the weaving.

The relevance of having potluck lunches at our meetings was discussed of different diet requirements among our members; the general consent was to continue as is, those with dietary requirements can bring a potluck item that suits their needs.

County fairs were discussed. The guild is open to supporting fairs in all counties, but the San Juan Co Fair seems to be the only one that solicits our support. Anna Kinney, a courtesy member, has been involved for years, but more recently Jere L. has been an active participant.

We were reminded that we will continue with our usual service project; so, get started making hats, scarf s, and mittens! Collection will be at the November meeting.

Caroline S. updated the group on our web page and Facebook. Caroline also gave a report on 3 children's weaving classes that have received our support through donated supplies; especially of note was the Zephyr Cove school in Nevada.

New business was a discussion of ideas for future programs. We agreed that a Color Challenge project would be launched at the September meeting. (i.e. participants draw 3 crayon colors from a bag and are challenged to weave (or knit/crochet?) a project using those colors.

Even though some confessed to having no current projects, we did have an interesting show and tell. The meeting was adjourned, and a picnic lunch was enjoyed both on the deck and in the much cooler kitchen.

In the absence of our secretary, Karinne, Sherry H. took notes, typed by Kathy S.

The next installment in our review of online educational opportunities is **Jane Stafford's School of Weaving** which was launched in 2017. There are currently 6 seasons of lessons beginning with the fundamentals of weaving (how to warp your loom, etc.). Each season includes several online episodes that build on previous knowledge, from plain weave through twills, lace, and unit weaves. A subscription lasts for a year, and you can work at your own pace. The School of Weaving also has its own forum which allows members to share ideas, projects and to ask questions.


